R.R. Smith Board of Directors processed 19 grant applications on March 8th. Requests totaled over \$60,000 and the Board of Directors was able to grant \$21,200 to educational charities. A list of the 2016 grants will be published in the Postscript and is on line at www.rrsmith.ca. Charities outside B.C. were in Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Bangladesh, Zambia, India, sub-Saharan Africa, Nepal, Guatemala, Odisha, India, and Brazil. Charities in BC were Decoda literacy organization serving 400 BC communities, Vancouver Opera Spring Break Opera Camp, Start Up! Supporting early career teachers, Betty Huff Theatre program in Surrey, and the Dyslexia program in BC. We are happy to say that all applicants received grant money. Is there a Canadian Registered Educational Charity needing funds in your community?

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## Families for Children

Hello, my name is Sathi. My parents left me wandering the streets when I was only 4 years old. I do not know why they did not want me.

The police brought me to FFC. I was kind of scared but soon learned that I was not alone anymore. There was food, clothes and medicine, and pretty soon I learned to read, write, draw and play with other kids who were just like me. That was a long time ago. Most of the children never used pencils or crayons or paints, and books were only things we had heard about on the streets.

We went to school at FFC and I found it hard. Many of us did not understand why 6x9=54. We memorized the answers to pass the exams. Many students failed, even the ones in Kindergarten and Grade 1. We misbehaved a lot. But this changed with the help of our volunteers. Our teachers were soon able to buy school supplies such as text books, pencils, crayons, paints and notebooks. I even went with my teacher to buy Bengali library books. We love to read.

FFC doesn't just look after orphans, handicapped children or babies that are left at the door, they also go into the slums and bring those children into the FFC family. We went with 2 volunteers, Muriel Hemmes and Linda Rosas, to visit these children. The parents were pleased to meet us and served tea. Did you know that many of these children never held a pencil or toothbrush? We taught them how to wash their hands with soap. They love coming to our class.

Linda and Muriel organized Montesorri classes for the younger students as well as those in the special care area. Sometimes the older students get time in these classes to use all these neat things. I loved helping the younger children. If anyone misbehaves, they have to leave the class and no one likes this to happen! The boys and girls in special care like using all the blocks and large games. They are learning, too. And you know, all of us concentrate on our work now and most of us understand some of those difficult math questions.

I am now in grade 10 and like learning. So a big thank you from all the FFC children to the RR Smith Foundation for their support in making this possible.

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R.R. Smith Members:

I was out of the country until Monday and am just digging through my mail between preparing for workshops when I discovered your letter from the RR Smith Foundation about the Start UP! and of course, the cheque for shipping and booklets. I thought I'd let you know it's helping right now.

On Monday we will be doing a workshops at Templeton Secondary in Vancouver. You can read about the program in the attachment.

We will be webcasting 2 workshops, and today I went out to the school, and copied and mailed out booklets to 11 new teachers who are watching via webcast. The bill today was \$85 so far for shipping and handouts.

We ran out of books and needed to order more, which we will send out next week. The 1st book, Love that Dog is a great book for TOCs, because they can do a read aloud from the book and create many language arts lessons. The other book is The First Week of School, how to start up your class in the critical first week. Both cost us about \$5 ea. to buy or print plus shipping to the teachers.

We charge \$20-30 to teachers who do not have Pro D support, for the webcast of the full day of workshops and booklets and handouts while we learn the techniques of webcasting. I think it is promising way to support teachers all over BC.

Thanks for your support. It already is helping!
