BRIGHT BEGINNINGS FOUNDATION

Bright Beginnings Foundation (BBF) would like to thank R.R. Smith Memorial Foundation for the grants that you have given us. Together we are making a life-long difference in the lives of lowincome Surrey students.

BBF gives the opportunity to a promising graduating Surrey student, living with very difficult financial challenges, to attain a post-secondary education. The BBF Bursary provides full tuition, student fees and educational materials. When these students have completed their education, they will have a skill, trade or diploma that will allow them to get a decent paying job. Our intention is two-fold:

- We feel it is just to give Surrey high school graduates, regardless of family income, an equal opportunity to attend a post-secondary institution and obtain a career.
- 2. We intend to lift students and their families out of generational poverty.

Thanks in part to R.R. Smith Memorial Foundation's previous grant, BBF was able to provide three small grants to students to help them pursue their post-secondary education. These students all live with severe financial challenges and have to make a very difficult choice. Pursuing a post-secondary education -- and thereby attaining a career that will permanently relieve their difficult situation -- or continuing to survive on a day-to-day basis. This year for the first time, BBF is delighted to announce that we have awarded our first full bursary to a student. Our student has a strong academic record and is living at home with four family members all trying to survive on one inadequate income. BBF is committed to helping this family, and others, permanently break the cycle of poverty.

We are thrilled to inform you and your Newsletter readers that BBF will be holding our second annual Banquet. Last year, our "Working Together for a Bright Future" Banquet was a tremendous success. This year our banquet will be held on April 12th and promises to be bigger and better! We are working on the program now and are excited about our speakers, M/C and entertainment. We will have bigger raffles and more silent auction items as well. And even better... YOU ARE INVITED!!

We also are planning to hold a Walk-a-thon with our affiliate organization, KEATCA, in the Spring. We will be working with Secondary Schools in Surrey to raise awareness of the issue of poverty in our community.

We wish to again thank R.R. Smith Memorial Foundation for your support. The difference we will make in the lives of individual students and their families is immense.

IN MEMORY OF GLEN PINCH



Glen Pinch was a librarian at Langley Senior Secondary School until his retirement. Upon retirement, he became involved in the Langley Retired Teachers' Association, the R.R. Smith Memorial Fund Foundation and serving on the B.C.R.T.A. Board of Directors.

Glen served on the executive and was President of the Langley Retired Teachers' Association for a number of years. During his tenure he established the "To Hell With The Bell" brunch in 1998. That tradition is still practiced each year except now it is called "No Bell Brunch". Another of his projects was to find funding to publish the "History of Langley Schools" a book written by Maureen Pepin, Harry McTaggart and Norm Sherritt. He turned to the R.R. Smith Memorial Fund Foundation and received a grant to finance the publication. Glen attended many LRTA lunches and often brought guests.

Glen served on the R.R. Smith Memorial Fund Foundation Board of Directors from 2000 to 2011. In 2010, he advocated for a \$1.00 per fee paying member at the Annual General Meeting and was successful in having the funding passed. For many years Glen had his annual vacation in Costa Rica with Ollie Whitcutt, Tom Brunker and friends. This group enthusiastically supported a nearby school called Atenas. Through donations to R.R. Smith, the school was equipped with many educational items such as a photo copier, learning materials, playground equipment, etc. It is during his travels that Glen acquired artwork from local artists that he has donated to R.R. Smith.

Glen became elected to the B.C.R.T.A. Board of Directors. His hard work and sage advice helped to make the B.C.R.T.A. what it is today.

Glen saw the need to inform members of the many social concerns facing retired teachers as the internet grew and rapid changes took place. The B.C.R.T.A. Social Concerns Committee was formed and Glen was the first Chair. Later Glen saw the need to not only inform members of the social concerns but to also advocate for members.

Thus, he worked on establishing the B.C.R.T.A. Advocacy Committee before he left the Board.

Glen was an avid Bridge player. During the breaks at the B.C.R.T.A. AGM he and 3 friends would often be off in a corner playing Bridge.

Besides all his work on behalf of his fellow retirees, Glen advised and helped tenants in his complex when asked. Glen was a good friend to many.

He is sorely missed.
